Saint-Chamant

Champagne Saint-Chamant was established in 1930 by Pierre and Hélène Coquillette. Their son, Christian, took over the estate in 1950. Located in Epernay, it's a very ordinary house with no sign, nothing that would reveal its' labyrinthine cellar, built in the early 19th century, is a mile long and absolutely packed with Champagne bottles. The charming, moustached, and now elderly Monsieur Christian Coquillette is a firm believer in aging Champagne and it is hard to say how many bottles he has in his cellar, but most likely in the hundreds of thousands! Christian exploits 11.50 ha of vineyards (almost exclusively Chardonnay) in Chouilly, a village classified as Grand Cru in the Côte des Blancs, as well as a small amount in Epernay. The vineyards are planted on limestone soil, growing on 10 inches of arable earth and directly on the "roche mere" or mother rock made of chalk descending for tens of meters. The characteristic of the sub-soil adds to the expression of aromas from the fruit and creates a refined wine. Saint-Chamant specializes primarily in Blanc de Blancs. They do make a rosé; however Chardonnay is the dominant grape, making up 90% of the blend. The remaining 10% Pinot Meunier & Pinot Noir gives the champagne its color. Their champagnes are of great quality, very age worthy, with extremely fine bubbles. They are regularly awarded medals by the Concours Général

Stéphane Coquillette

Champagne Coquillette is situated in Chouilly, a village classified as Grand Cru in the Côte des Blancs. Stéphane Coquillette is a fourth generation winemaker in Champagne. His grandparents (Pierre and Hélène Coquillette) established the marque Champagne Saint-Chamant in 1930. In 1950, Stéphane's father Christian took over the estate, which he still runs today. When Stéphane came of age, Christian sent him off on his own, thus Stéphane created and runs his own estate, Champagne S. Coquillette. The majority of the grapes come from Chouilly (Grand Cru), Cuis (Premier Cru 99%) for Chardonnay, d'Aÿ (Grand Cru) and Mareuil/Aÿ (Premier Cru 99%) for the Pinot Noir grapes. The vineyards are planted on limestone soil, growing on 10 inches of arable earth and directly on the "roche mere" or mother rock made of chalk descending for tens of meters. The characteristic of the sub-soil adds to the expression of aromas from the fruit and creates a refined wine. The vineyards are worked in part by plough and then the ground is covered with bark in order to stop erosion and prevent weeds from sprouting. Herbicides are avoided at all costs. Everything is done by hand, such as trellising and pruning, which avoids disease and allows for a healthy crop. There are four wine presses of 75 and 150 hectolitres. The juice is then stored in their new winery built in 2001. More than ten different parcels

Diebolt-Vallois

A great personality in Champagne, Jacques Diebolt is a passionate and fascinating alchemist who extracts the quintessence of its best terroir. Established in 1959, this family run domaine has 22.5 acres of vines in the village of Cramant in the Côte des Blancs. Jacques Diebolt, together with his daughter Isabelle and son Arnaud, produce magnificent Champagnes from the Chardonnay grape. Although Chardonnay has difficulty ripening in most of the Champagne region, the long warm days, relatively low rainfall and chalky soil of the Côte de Blancs are ideally suited to the grape. In 1992, the influential and opinionated guide, Gault Millau, named Diebolt-Vallois "Champagne Producer of the Year" and since that time, demand for their Champagne has far exceeded the small (7,000 cases) production.

Gonet-Médeville (Organic)

Xavier Gonet's youthful looks and boyish smile suggest a gentleman 10 years removed from his university in age but not in spirit. His easy-going demeanor and comfortable stature might at first seem more natural strolling across the quad of a college campus than a vineyard. (In fact, enologist professors from the University of Reims were family friends and often guests at the Gonet home.) But just a short time with Xavier will reveal a determination and commitment that is anything but casual. His impish grin will quickly give way to pursed lips as he carefully weighs your question and takes pains not to deprive any detail of its true worth. Xavier took control of 8 hectares of vineyards from his parents in 2000 and works them by hand. His parcels of Pinot Noir (Bisseuil and Ambonnay) & Chardonnay (Mesnil-Sur-Oger) are farmed organically and each parcel is vinified separately to emphasize it's individual terroir. There is no malolactic fermentation and dosage is minute. The results are wines that show Xavier's unassuming focus and care as clearly as his wit.

Chateau Gilette (Bordeaux)

Some 30 years ago, Martine was invited to a tasting of Gilette -- vintages of the 40s, 50s, & 60s. It was a truly hedonistic experience. Although Gilette was not included in the 1855 classification, its wines can compete with the best. Julie Gonet-Médeville is often called "l'antiquaire du Sauternes." What does this lively young woman have to do with antiques? The answer lies in her family history: For more than half a century, the Médevilles have let their Sauternes age for decades in concrete vats. The wines never see the inside of a wooden barrel—they go directly from vat to bottle. In the 1930s, Julie's grandfather, René de Médeville, was feeling the effects of the economic slump that had hit the whole area. He decided to build concrete vats to replace the barrels that were both costly and hard to come by. After a few years, he observed that the wines were breathing well, maturing more slowly and developing more complex aromas. Unique in the world and therefore unique in the Bordeaux region, the Médevilles do not sell their wines until they have been aged for more than 20 years. Thus Château Gilette, a Sauternes petit cru, became legendary for its old vintages. Grape varieties: Sémillon 94%, Sauvignon blanc 4%, Muscadelle 2%. Les Justices (a more traditional Sauternes), located to the west of the Gironde River, produces plump, intensely concentrated, powerful wines. Grape varieties are: Semillon 88%, Sauvignon blanc 8%, Muscadelle 4%. Does Julie ever get confused producing wines that are so different from one another? "In a profession like winemaking, which can be tough and repetitive, diversity's a good thing," she insists. However, it's hands off at Château Gilette: "You have to get used to the idea that wine put in a vat today won't be sold for another 20 years," she says. "It's a whole different

Château Respide-Médeville

Julie Gonet-Médeville, renowned winemaker at Château Gilette, uses the same insight to coax great Graves Blanc and Rouge from the vineyards of Château Respide-Médeville. When Julie's father, Christian Médeville, took over the reigns in 1959, he expanded the family estate by integrating Chateau Respide-Médeville. The property is located at the south of Bordeaux and is situated to the east of Preignac, in the small commune of Toulence, close to Langon. The purity of fruit shines through for both the red and white Graves from Château Respide Médeville. The Graves Rouge benefits from a well-balanced blend of 60% Cabernet Sauvignon and 40% Merlot. The sandy and gravelly clay soil is perfectly suited to the making of great dry white wine as well. Their Graves Blanc is a barrel fermented blend of Sauvignon Blanc and Semillon. In an appellation where Châteaux are more celebrated than soils, the Médevilles choose to celebrate what makes the Graves their home—the gravel soils that define it.

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ALSACE

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Domaine Rémy Gresser (Biodynamic)

Located in Andlau (a prime spot in the Bas-Rhin), half way between Colmar and Strasbourg, Domaine Rémy Gresser dates back to 1520, beginning with Thibault Gresser, a viticulturist and appointed provost of Andlau. Today, Rémy, a biodynamic wine grower, continues the family wine making tradition tending to his 35.5 acres. His estate produces three Grands Crus: Kastelberg, Wiebelsberg and Moenchberg. The geology is extremely complex, and the three Grands Crus are very different in style. Wiebelsberg is the largest Grand Cru, and its sandstone gives very floral, lively Rieslings. Moenchberg, on granite, fossil limestone, produces succulent wines. Here Riesling performs very well. From Kastelberg, a unique terroir on Steige schist, a handful of growers produce some of Alsace's most exciting wines, loaded with minerality. His crus or lieu dits (designated vineyards) are Brandhof (limestone), Duttenberg (clay-marne) and Kritt (gravelly soil). Each vineyard gives the wine a distinctive flavor. Rémy produces exciting wines of great purity and expression due to the soil from which they come. The average age of the vines is 40 years. These wines are food friendly and have no residual sugar with the exception of his late harvest and selection de grains nobles of amazing complexity.

KRITT: Southeast of the village Andlau, the predominant soil of the Kritt lieu-dit is graves (gravel). This produces wines with a stony and pebbly texture on the palate.

MOENCHBERG: Moenchberg covers a gently sloping hillside, with southeastern exposure, at an altitude between 230 and 260 metres. The soil is fossil limestone, with a texture that is very fine, clayey or silty, sometimes calcareous near the crest. One of the oldest vineyards of

KASTELBERG: Steep slopes exposed to the south, at an altitude ranging from 240 to 300 metres. One of the rare vineyard areas established on soils of the Vosges basement, it lies on the Steige schist of the Silurian age, unique in Alsace, which has been metamorphosed

WIEBELSBERG: Immediately to the east of the Kastelberg, seated between 250 and 300 metres elevation with southern exposure. This first foothill, east of the Vosges fault consists of Upper Vosges sandstone, partially covered on the lower slopes by Quaternary reworked clayey sandstone scree. The soil is loose, sandy, well-drained and heats up quickly.

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RHONE

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Bernard Burgaud

Bernard Burgaud just might be Ken Wright's French frère in Côte-Rôtie. Burgaud treats Syrah and the different lieux-dits of Côte-Rôtie with the same passion and attention that Wright gives to the most exalted vineyards of Willamette Valley. This is no doubt in part due to Bernard's studies and work in Beaune. More akin to the Cote d'Or, Côte-Rôtie is much cooler than the rest of the Rhone and each vineyard is singular and unique based on its exposure and spot on the many varied steep slopes. Burgaud's expansive knowledge of the terroir is the secret to knowing when each parcel has reached phenolic ripeness, with vineyards separated by less than a mile sometimes being harvested two weeks apart. It truly takes such subtle skill to produce a wine as powerful and seductive as great Côte-Rôtie.

Féraud-Brunel

Féraud-Brunel is a promising negociant enterprise that began in 1998 with the partnership between Laurence Féraud and André Brunel of Châteauneuf-du-Pape. Brunel is best known for Les Cailloux and Féraud is known for Pegau. Given their significant contacts in the southern Rhône Valley, their goal is to purchase wine from old, established, primarily Grenache vineyards. What sets this venture apart from other negociants is that it is run with the savoir-faire of truly exceptional winemakers working in perfect partnership. Before the harvest, they work in the same manner as on their estates in Châteauneuf-du-Pape, setting the yields and the farming practices, and closely following the ripening and sanitary state of the grapes. The fermentation of each wine is adapted to the qualities of the terroir, and when they feel the moment is right, they bring the wines to their cellars in Châteauneuf-du-Pape. After a period of ageing that marries the expression of terroir with a hard core of ripe fruit, the wines are bottled without fining or filtration.

Domaine de Font-Sane

Domaine de Font-Sane is one of the most rewarding stops in the lovely village of Gigondas, due in no small part to the enormous talent and gracious manner of the Veronique Peysson-Cunty. Passed down from father to daughter, Veronique is the 4th generation of the Peysson family to practice viticulture and wine making at this outstanding Gigondas estate. All the parcels used for the Gigondas are in sight of this small winery where the view of the rugged Dentelles de Montmirail is nothing short of spectacular. Vines average nearly 40 years old, with the youngest (20 years) planted hundreds of meters up the foot of the Dentelles de Montmirail, important parcels of 50 year old vines on the middle slopes, and a small plot of 100 year old vines adjacent to the house and cellars on more level ground. Lutte raisonnée, hand sorting and picking, and a careful attention to the expression of terroir make this 27 acre estate a standard bearer for the appellation. In blind tastings among the growers of Gigondas, Font-Sane is often chosen as the best of the appellation. Veronique's counterparts contend that her wine exhibits a certain feminine charm which is both easily identifiable and immediately ingratiating because it provides a counterpoint to the

Domaine Gris des Bauries

Domaine Gris des Bauries was created in 2004 by Patrick, a highly reputed mason, in love with winemaking and Gina, the daughter of the baker. Gina's father had given up his oven for a vineyard and, upon retirement, passed on to Patrick his old grenaches. Luckily, Patrick had learnt from his father, a winegrower, how to respect vines. In fact, he always dreamt of growing vines himself. He really believes that it's in his genes. Every year, they say, they will achieve better elegance and extract more subtle flavors from their carefully grown grapes. Patrick does everything. He takes care of the vineyards as if they were his children. Gina keeps the accounts, oversees everything, packs the bottles and shares her enthusiasm with customers. The old Grenaches - 40 to 50 years old, maybe more - mostly grow on top of a beautiful hill.

Château St. Estève d'Uchaux

The Français family has been in this picturesque area since 1809, when they purchased the grand estate Saint Estève. Originally they raised silk worms and sheep, with most of the land dedicated to forestry. Experimenting with viniculture, 45 acres of Viognier were planted at the beginning of the century. The experiment paid off with the vineyard bearing lush, fragrant fruit. Today, Château Saint Estève is run with great care by Marc Français. The sloped vineyards produce the classic Rhône varieties: Viognier, Roussanne, Grenache Blanc and Clairette for the whites and Grenache, Syrah, Cinsault, and Mourvedre for the reds. The 160 acres planted are meticulously tended by Monsieur Français. Vines average 40 years in age.

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Gilles Robin (Organic)

Nestled against the hillsides of Hermitage and St. Joseph, the appellation Crozes-Hermitage gives rise to powerful, elegant wines which are rightfully taking their place next to those of its more famous neighbors. Striving to break free of the "younger brother" status to which Crozes is so often relegated, rising star Gilles Robin is producing wines of passion and exuberance, revelatory of the soil from which they come, and greatly rewarding to those who seek them out. With a family history of winegrowing spanning four generations, Robin started out the way many in the Rhône do: his family sold grapes to the local cooperative. The majority of the estate was planted in the late 1940's by Robin's grandparents, and it is this fruit that makes up his Cuvée Alberic Bouvet. The Cuvée Papillon is the product of vines Robin himself planted in 1996. His modest estate now totals 15 hectares, including 1 hectare planted to white varietals and a small parcel of Syrah in St. Joseph. Robin's vines are planted in the stony and sandy "La Terrasse de Chassis" district, just south of the hill of Hermitage. Robin distinguishes himself from other Crozes producers by farming his plots organically, believing this to be the best way in which to honestly give voice to the terroir. His Cuvée Alberic Bouvet is aged in oak barrels of which 20% are new. The Cuvée Papillon is aged entirely in tank to preserve its fresh

Château Rayas / Château Fonsalette (Organic)

The hardest task is to summarize all that Chateau Rayas embodies in a paragraph. Emmanuel and Françoise Reynaud impress and charm with their talent and knowledge of the land they own and love. Walking through the vineyards of Rayas and sticking one's hand in the sandy soil, one can imagine how water quickly drains away from the thirsty vines and leaves them to struggle and stress, ultimately creating the haunting, enamoring wines that are the signature of this Estate. As one walks through the pine forests between the vineyards, sand climbs up the sides of your shoes and a constant breeze always seems to touch your sun-burned cheeks. Old Grenache vines reach up out of the barren ground displaying small bunches of grapes like a precious offering in the palm formed by each gnarly, grey hand. From these meager yields (often a ton or less an acre) comes one of the most revered and enigmatic wines ever fashioned. The heady concoction of wild strawberry, raspberry, kirsch and a healthy dose of black pepper is instantly recognizable for its singular and matchless character that defies summary. This wine was recently released directly from the estate. Emmanuel Reynaud has stated that one thing he wanted to do (that his uncle did not) was

Château des Tours (Organic)

Situated in an old Maison flanked on both sides by tall towers (hence Des Tours), Emmanuel took over this Château from his father Bernard (Jacques' brother) in 1989. Emmanuel now runs both Château Rayas and Des Tours and treats them as siblings. The vineyards are tended with the same organic methods, manually plowed, harvested much later than other producers, and centered around a reverence for old vine Grenache. Always direct, Emmanuel notes "We want ripe fruit. We will harvest late if necessary. You must know how to take risks to win. You must be ready to lose." Total commitment and in turn total devotion

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Domaine Georges Vernay

Condrieu remains a rarity that was well publicized by the late Fernand Point, the ever memorable Chef of the 3-stars Michelin La Pyramide restaurant in the town of Vienne, France. Condrieu possesses a fantastic combination of powerful fullness and delicacy with a spicy earthiness. Georges Vernay once wrote "The Viognier is a difficult vine, full of caprice and never wholly predictable". Christine Vernay is as talented as her father. Her syrahs under the label of Côtes du Rhône, Saint-Joseph and Côte-Rotie are tremendously powerful without excess, rich and flavorful, aromatic and spicy. The only problem is that their production is small, but to share a bottle of Georges Vernay Estate is a privilege.

Domaine Laporte

The great pride of Laporte is the Domaine du Rochoy. Located in the commune of Bannay, the Domaine is a single 25 acre slope, unique in the region of Sancerre. It was, in the past, a Roman-Gallo quarry called "Rochetum." Situated at the edge of the Catonis Villa, overhanging the Loire River, the sun soaked flinty slopes absorb heat during the day and warm the vineyard during the night. This enables the grapes to ripen early, resulting in an exceptional white Sancerre which is rich and well-balanced, with a fine, flinty tang.

Clos de la Brierie

From a family of winemakers in the Loire region since 1854, it was only natural that Vincent Girault continued in his family's footsteps. At the age of 18, he oversaw his first harvest and began to blend his own unique wines which reflect his passion for the terroir. In 1994, Vincent's parents converted the 10 hectares of Clos de la Brierie to a biodynamic vineyard. Vincent takes great care in the way he farms the land believing that biodynamic farming allows one to truly discover the unique flavors of the fruit. His wines garner the Demeter brand, meaning that his wines are produced biodynamically. They also bear the Ecocert and BIODYVIN certifications. "When we understand nature, it brings us great satisfaction in flavor," he says. When Vincent's parents retired in 1994 he took over the Clos de la Brierie. This vineyard was the property of the Count Eudes II of Blois. It is situated on the right bank of the Loire river between Blois and Tours facing the Château de Chaumont sur Loire. He only offers the vineyard's wines to a small group of restaurants in France and selected importers.

Pierre Soulez Savennières (Organic)

Château de Chamboureau is a 15 acre vineyard in the appellation Roche aux Moines. It is situated to the east of Coulée de Serrant, one of the prestigious classified growths of Savennières. La Roche aux Moines is situated in a very significant spot in the Loire valley – on the local shist veined with volcanic rock. The Château de Chamboureau vineyard is planted with vines more than 50 years old. Like his predecessors, Soulez is committed to producing wines that emphasize the dry, smokey and flinty character of the best Savennières. He severely cuts back the vines to reduce yields, harvests as late as possible (among the last of Savennières' vigneron), and does extended élevages to extract richness from the lees.

Louis Métaireau

Over the past two decades Jean-François Guilbaud and Marie-Luce Métaireau have taken the "artisanale" beginnings of her father and gone on to write their own chapter in the history of Muscadet. Grand Mouton began as a vision of Louis Métaireau's troupe of "Les Vignerons d'Art." The name Mouton echos an older French term "mothon" meaning mound, and is in reference to the elevated position and status of the original vineyard purchased by Louis and his group in 1972. Jean-François and Marie-Luce began purchasing parcels of this vineyard in 1988 with the goal of bringing the cherished vineyards of their two families together under one house. Vines planted as far back as 1937 root into the rocky terroir composed of gneiss, mica, garnet and amphibolite -a recipe of stones between the Sevre and Maine rivers known as the most highly regarded of the Muscadet appellations. While we carve our turkeys, hang our stockings and dye our eggs, these wines are 'faire ses pâcques' (literally 'make their Easter'), resting sur lie to develop richness and depth, and bottled by gravity with no filtration. Jean-François and Marie-Luce are truly les Vignerons d'Art.

Jean-Marc Brocard

To say the Brocards are passionate about terroir does not go far enough. For the Brocards, the very word Chablis means terroir. Because Jean-Marc believes that "the truth of a wine lies in the soil where it has grown," the emphasis is put into caring for the vineyards and striving for minimal intervention during vinification. Stainless steel tanks, organic practices in the vineyards, low yields and daring to pick only when phenologically ripe all accentuate the minerality and rapier acidity that so define Chablis. The most telling aspect of where the Brocards' heart lies is revealed at the dinner table. When hosting friends and family, the most prized bottle on the table is not from the Grand Cru Les Clos, or a top 1er cru such as Montée de Tonnerre. His pride is the Chablis "Vieilles Vignes" AC from 100+ year old vines directly next to the winery. Denoted 'Domaine St Claire' after the 15th century chapel that lies in the middle of the vineyard, the Chablis "Vieilles Vignes" undoubtedly lies on hallowed ground.

Chevalier Père et Fils

When Claude Chevalier took control of the family cellars in 1994 the first thing he instituted was a new mindset. His father made wines that were built on the most recognizable trait of any traditionalist—they did not budge. As with many of the 'old guard', Père Chevalier's wines had timeless insight, but were not the most outgoing personalities in their youth. Claude feels that just as it is his father's obligation to carry on the heritage of the Côte de Beaune with wines that are age-worthy, it is the duty of his own generation to make wines that are ageless. Claude's arrival was quickly followed with renovation in the cellar and an emphasis that the wine is made first and finally in the vineyards. Henri Mayer noted that wine should prove good to drink young as well as old and should leave one with the impression that you are always tasting great wine although it never tastes quite the same. I think in Chevalier we have found a Domaine that takes this quest to heart.

Bruno Clavelier (Biodynamic)

Located at the entrance of Vosne-Romanée, Bruno Clavelier's domaine is truly a family affair. A 5th generation vigneron, Bruno succeeded his grandfather at the family's 16 acre Domaine, which has been farmed organically before the term was invented. His grandfather never used any chemicals or potassium fertilizers, only manure from his cattle. 95% of the vineyards are planted in traditional Pinot Noir Fin by "Sélection Massale" (an old practice of hand-selecting cuttings from the very best vineyards). Average vine age is between 55 to 70 years and thus most wines are labeled "Vieilles Vignes." Bruno's wines show great purity of terroir. His parcels in Vosne-Romanée are the very history of the village. To give them a just voice, Bruno uses a light hand to craft wines of such purity that the terroir is the commanding voice in the choir. He also surprises with a great white: a Bourgogne Aligoté from 70 years old vines, which is absolutely stunning.

Dominique Cornin (Biodynamic)

The individual vineyards of Dominique Cornin are an apt reflection of the man himself. Each parcel carries a part of the family's history in the Mâconnais. Les Chevrières holds the same plot his father planted over 50 years ago. Clos Reyssié bears fruit from the same vines his father put to seed in 1938. The 100 year-old parcel in Les Serreudières reaches even further into the past of Cornin's roots in the vineyards. In the same manner that these old vines labor to yield the fruit, Dominique subtly guides the wine from vine to bottle with little interjection. Such is the unassuming standard of high quality from Cornin. Dominique bottles both of his Mâcon-Villages from their respective villages, with an emphasis to reflect the individual parcels with each bottling. He farms by the same biodynamic methods as the acclaimed Domaine Leroy, Leflaive and Zind-Humbrecht; yet his wines sell for a fraction of their prices. Dominique's only motive is to give his vineyards the best chance

A story familiar to many of the brightest young faces of Burgundy both past and present, Pascal inherited his family vineyards and decided to strike away from the path of his parents who had sold the grapes off in bulk. Pascal began bottling for himself in 1993 and it has been everyone's good fortune. As Allen Meadows noted recently in Burghound: "Danjean is

Michel Gay & Fils

When Martine visited Christophe Perrot-Minot in December 2005, she was greeted by a fresh face beside him in the cellars: Christophe's talented new assistant, Jérôme. At the end of their tasting, Christophe asked Martine if she would be willing to visit and taste with Jérôme's brother, Sébastien Gay. What she encountered was a young man fit to bear the torch for Burgundy's latest vanguard. Sébastien's manner suggests the same qualities as his wines: he is thoughtful and earnest, with a purity of soul that is no less than a looking glass into the land from which he sprouted (much the same as the old vines that make up his vineyards). These wines are intimate and alluring, passionate but not aggressive. They pointedly volunteer their terroir in the same voice through which Sébastien declares his regional pride. It seems fitting that Christophe introduced Martine to Sébastien in the same way Christophe himself met her through Denis Merlot.

Paul Janin (Biodynamic)

The Beaujolais cru Moulin-à-Vent inherited its name from the stoic windmill that has overlooked these vineyards since the 15th century. In the same silent, steadfast manner, Paul Janin and his family have tended their 60 to 80+ year old Gamay vines. Farmed using biodynamic methods, the Janins oversee the fruit from its inception in the vineyard to its final resting place in the bottle. Flaky, pink granite soil high in manganese (Mn) produces structured, powerful wines. With robust, meaty flavors shored by acidity that begs for hearty fare, Janin's reds have proven to be as steadfast as the Moulin-à-Vent itself, only gaining in character as they patiently age.

Georges Jayet (Emmanuel Rouget)

Georges Jayet (Henri's Jayet's brother) owned a plot of Echezeaux that Henri tended on his behalf. Although bottled under the label Domaine Georges Jayet, the wine was solely produced by Henri, who made the wine through the 1995 vintage. With the 1996 vintage, Emmanuel Rouget (Henri Jayet's nephew) took over tending the parcel and doing everything from pruning, picking, élevage and bottling the Georges Jayet wine. Henri continued in an advisory role with Emmanuel and tasted with him, but the actual making of the wines have been Emmanuel's responsibility since Henri's retirement. The Nuits-Saint-Georges comes from a parcel of 'Les Chouillets', which Emmanuel has taken care of

Francois & Antoine Jobard

François Jobard is the second producer whose wines Martine began importing, some 30 years ago, shortly after Château Rayas. Those first bottles of Meursault are probably just now hitting their stride. Sharing the personality of the maker, Jobard's wines are discreet, reserved and introverted in their youth. His enigmatic wines, driven by searing acidity, have encouraged countless wine writers and critics to wax poetic about the wholly individual character of Jobard's singular Meursaults. François and his son Antoine tend their 12 acres by hand and believe the bulk of the work is done in the vineyard. Intervention in the cellar is minimal, and where Jobard leaves his biggest mark is in what he does not do. There is little to no 'batonnage', as the wines are allowed to age on their lees for up to two years in barrel, with little new oak used. The result? Wines that have inspired Remington Norman to cite Jobard as "One of the best Domaines in Meursault, run by a man who inspires

Morey-Coffinet

The son of Marc Morey, Michel and his wife Fabienne (from the Pillot clan) began the Morey-Coffinet Domaine in the late 1970s with a dowry of vineyards bestowed on them by two families with extensive history in Chassagne. With a stable foundation of Premier Crus from the south-east facing hillside which Clive Coates calls "the best section for white Chassagne," Michel's whites speak to the very essence of Chassagne, with fragrant aromas of orchard blossoms, green apple, pears and spice all framed by powerful minerality. Michel also has a deft hand with Chassagne rouge. His reds capture the roasted, muscular aromas of Chassagne rouge terroir, but are framed by a silky texture and balance

Emmanuel Rouget

Emmanuel Rouget came under his famous uncle Henri Mayer's tutelage in 1977, when he was hired to help him at the estate. Rouget had a deep love for viticulture and quickly excelled. By the mid 1980's Rouget had taken over much of the winemaking. Critics quickly began singing Emmanuel Rouget's praises, calling him "no young iconoclast, but a masterfully trained traditionalist and worthy successor to his mentor." Believing that the best fruit produces the best wines, Rouget uses no pesticides, hand plows the vines to force their roots deep into the soil, and prunes rigorously. With only 7.5 acres of very low yielding vines, the wines of Emmanuel Rouget are made in tiny quantities. By and large, Emmanuel has remained faithful to the techniques employed by Henri Mayer - namely an insistence on ultra low yields, a pre-fermentation cold maceration and the maturation of the wines in 100% new oak barrels. His wines are now very highly rated and keenly sought-after by

Denis Mortet

"The late Denis Mortet's wife Laurence and their son Arnaud have taken over the domaine and by the looks of things, haven't missed a beat as both of them were already working full time at the domaine. Moreover, Arnaud was already responsible for the majority of the vineyard work and had actually vinified the '05s under Denis' tutelage. As one might reasonably expect given that Arnaud can now apply his own touches to the domaine, he told me that he has changed several things. One quite fundamental change is that he wants more elegance and finesse in his wines and thus the style of the domaine's wines will necessarily change going forward. Two, he has elected to reduce the percentage of new wood, particularly for the villages wines; they will still see plenty as the reduction is only from 100% to 70%." –Allen Meadows/Burghound

Patrice Rion has been making wine since 1977 at Domaine Daniel Rion. In 1990, he and his wife Michèle started on their own with 1 hectare and now their estate is 5.50 hectares encompassing multiple appellations. In 2000, Patrice started a negociate business under S.A.R.L. Patrice Rion: he contracts with vineyards owners who have to agree to a vineyard maintenance with environmentally friendly farming practices in order to produce the best possible grapes. Their son, Maxime is in charge of these vineyards. Their wines are refined, elegant, and show the true character of the terroir, without over-extraction and lots of new oak. Very seductive wine indeed. Don't miss their Nuits St. Georges, "Les Terres Blanches", a white wine full of character, so different from our Côtes de Beaune white appellations.

Perrot-Minot

One of Burgundy's hottest rising stars, Christophe Perrot-Minot's talent was instantly recognized when he joined his father at the Domaine in 1990. An inquisitive nature, passion for terroir and the ability to compare successful practices with his friends Denis Mortet and Claude Dugat (who were traveling the same path as Christophe from raw talent to realized greatness) all allowed Christophe to hone his skills as a vigneron. It is Christophe's emphasis on stellar raw materials that make this Domaine so special. With an average age of 50+ years across all his vines (many parcels well exceed 80+ years), well-placed, family parcels and some of the lowest yields in Burgundy (lower than Mortet's and in some vintages Domaine Leroy and DRC) Christophe's focus begins in the vineyards. Green harvests, pruning, plowing and spending endless hours in the vineyards are coupled with minimal intervention in the cellar. The press juice is separated and often declassified, and there is a minimal amount of pigeage (punching down) and racking. The resulting wines are exquisitely balanced between power and finesse and display a sexy, voluptuous character that is as tantalizing as it is distinct.

Jean Thévenet (Organic)

Standing in the vineyards of Domaine de la Bongran earlier this year, Jean Thévenet explained the difference in health between his organic vineyard and that of his distant neighbor (who uses pesticides and fertilizers). Transitioning to the subject of the appellation's history, our National Sales Manager asked Jean, "How old are these vines?" Thévenet casually replied, "80 years old, some older." He continued, with real emphasis, "But the age of the vine is secondary, what is more important is the terroir!" Thévenet places the utmost importance on reaching ripeness levels that beget rich, concentrated wines (it should be noted that buttery malolactic does not enter into this discussion). Allen Meadows aptly summarized Thévenet's brilliance after his most recent visit to the Domaine: "As my tasting notes clearly demonstrate, these wines possess not only the ability to improve, but to last for decades. If you have never tasted the Thévenet wines, you owe it to yourself to give one a try."

Patrick Piuze

Patrick Piuze struck out on his own starting with the 2008 vintage, after making Chablis for Jean-Marc Brocard, Verget, and Olivier Leflaive. The years spent with these other producers allowed him to gain an intimate knowledge of the varied terroirs of Chablis while also getting to know the identities of the very best growers in the region. Patrick only works with old vines, within the original boundaries of the Chablis appellation, and he eschews corrections of any kind choosing to use no enzymes, no acidification and no chaptalization. There is no new wood here (he uses 7 to 9 year old barrels and stainless, depending on the wine). All the fruit is handpicked and sorted to ensure only the best makes it in the final cuvée. The wines are gently made using gravity, naturally fermented with wild yeast, and no cold stabilization. The result is wines of incredible purity, power, and sense of terroir leading Allen Meadows to proclaim "...the quality levels he has achieved are nothing short of sensational..." and Jancis Robinson to recently write "[Patrick Piuze] is a thrilling new producer of hand-crafted Chablis..." Patrick's stock is clearly on the rise and he is destined to be a star. Don't miss out on this exciting addition to the Martine's lineup.

Château du Cèdre

The vineyard of Château du Cèdre extends across the hillsides of Bru, in the commune of Vire-sur-Lot. The traditional grape varieties are grown on the best soil of Cahors: a very stony, clay-limestone terrain. The picturesque Cahors region in South West France has a long and illustrious history of wine-making. The principle grape varieties of the appellation are Malbec (known locally as Cot) and Tannat. These grape varieties produce massively dense and tannic wines that can be aggressive when young, but when given time to evolve, can develop wonderful complexity. During the 1990's, Château du Cèdre fine-tuned their wine-making operation. New state-of-the-art wine-making equipment was purchased and there was more investment in new oak barriques. Lately, micro-oxygenation of the wine stored in barrels has been used with great success. This technique, allied with judicious oak handling, has made the wines more approachable when young, while not impeding their aging ability.

Herri Mina (Biodynamic)

From the Basque country, at the very Southwesternmost part of France, Irouleguy received its appellation contrôlée in 1970. About 250 acres of vineyards are cultivated by 60 grapegrowers. One, Jean-Claude Berrouet, winemaker of Château Petrus, makes a white, a blend of Gros Manseng, Petit Corbu and Petit Manseng. The vines are planted on sometimes steep south facing slopes of the Pyrénées, no higher than 400 feet above sea level, to enjoy the Atlantic climatic influence. They are protected from cold north wind and receive more sunshine than most other French vineyard regions. A delicious, truly seductive wine that is an obvious favorite of the Basque restaurants, and certainly pairs well with our diversified California cuisine.

Château Tour de Farges

Napoleon lived on St Helena for 6 years to ruminate in his defeat at Waterloo. That bitter taste was tempered somewhat by the wines of Muscat de Lunel. This golden vin doux naturel was one of the few refreshments dispatched to him during his remaining years in exile. Muscat de Lunel shares many similarities to its cousin Beauges-de-Venise to its north. The same galets that are so well known in the Rhône pepper these vineyards just north of Montpellier. Lunel shares Beauges-de-Venise's fragrant, floral notes, but has a richer texture, adding a bit of fatness that would not shy away from a bit of Roquefort or any other Languedoc cheese one can conjure up.

Clos Uroulat / Charles Hours (Organic)

The French poet Colette advanced the reputation of Jurançon throughout the twentieth century with her ardent writings of the wine. 'When I was a teenager, I met a passionate prince, imperious traitor, like any great seducer: the Jurançon.' Like generations of growers before him, Charles Hours of Clos Uroulat takes great pride in the rich history and quality wines of the region. Located in the South of France near Pau, at the base of the Pyrénées Mountains, Jurançon is a hilly, relatively cool region. For the dry or sec wine, the main grape is Gros Manseng. It makes up 90% of Clos Uroulat's 'Cuvée Marie.' Jurançon Sec can only be described as an enigma, tantalizing the palate with cloying richness that is quickly replaced by a dry smoky, almond character that is as beautiful as the Pyrénées Mountains that surround it. Hours makes several tris or passes through the vineyard, hand picking

Berthet-Bondet

Jura might best be described as the Burgundy village that never came home from a sojourn in the Alpine meadows. Tucked away not 50 miles from Burgundy on the Swiss border in a narrow band of land known as Revermont (back mountain) is an area that can best be described as quirky (which is to say charming) and serene, with the wines to match. The great specialty of the region are the Vin Jaune wines made in the 'sous voile' (under veil) tradition of the Jura. The most apt description can only be determined by tasting it yourself. A juxtaposition of descriptors would suggest something like the nose of a great fino sherry (but more youthful) with the acidity of a young Vouvray (but more searing). Jean and Chantal Berthet-Bondet came to the village of Chateau-Chalon after shared studies in agronomy (and what better place for two agronomists than the Jura). Their love of the land quickly found them harvesting their first vintage in 1985 with an old barn housing the vats and the wines resting in the 16th century cellar underfoot of the domaine. The most minute details of each vineyard, varietal, wine and AOC have been carefully cataloged and explored in depth. It is a task that demands the utmost care and patience. Nestled in such an idyllic setting as this surrounded by wines that can outlast even the most determined spirit sounds like a charming (which is to say quirky) endeavor we all could envy.

Muhr - Van der Niepoort (Organic)

On the Spitzerberg in eastern-most Austria lies the five-hectare wine estate founded by Dirk van der Niepoort, of Port and Douro wines, and Dorli Muhr. On this south-facing slope, only tedious, painstaking efforts are implemented in order to preserve its old, cherished parcels – especially where the classic Blaufränkisch variety thrives. The Spitzerberg is a wine site that had fallen into oblivion over the last 50 years. But in earlier times, it was known as one of the best red wine sites in Austria. A western foothill of the Little Carpathians, the Spitzerberg features soils of pure chalk with an extremely thin layer of humus. It is also a nature conservation site. And because its climatic conditions and meager soils are unique in Central Europe, the Spitzerberg is particularly well known amongst biologists and plant researchers. The Spitzerberg's distinctive terroir, together with the spiciness of the Blaufränkisch variety and a relatively small production from old vines result in wines that reflect the tastes of the wine duo producers: elegant, not pompous, and with structure, length and plenty of freshness.

Cambrico (Organic)

Located to the north of Madrid, Bodegas Cámbrico sits in the heart of the National Park, Sierra de Francia, and is producing wines of intense aromatic quality and finish. Sierra de Francia is a breathtaking mountainous region, hidden away in a forgotten corner of southwestern Castilla y León. Bodega Cámbrico is situated at 2600-2950 feet, where the conditions are ideal to obtain grapes of extraordinary quality. The estate produces two main varieties: Tempranillo, and the obscure varietal Rufete, a cousin to Pinot Noir and brought to the region by Burgundian settlers over 400 years ago. The wines are all made from old vines (40 to 100 years) planted on terraces of granite and slate soil, formed during the Cambrian Age (about 500 million years ago). In addition to hand harvesting, all grapes are estate grown and farmed organically.

Gaston Rivière

A vin de liqueur enjoyed in France for centuries, Pineau des Charentes is enjoying a renaissance as Americans find again their love of cordials. The discovery of this unique liqueur is attributed to a winemaker who, in 1509, in the small town of Burie, unwittingly put fresh grape juice from the recent harvest into a barrel containing a small quantity of cognac. The next year, tasting through his wines, the man made an extraordinary discovery: a lively concoction that had both the freshness of fruit and the depth of brandy. Pineau des Charentes was born. Today, regulations require Pineau des Charentes to be made from grapes grown in the Cognac region and blended with young Cognac. Timing is essential, with the blending occurring within hours of pressing the grapes. Fermentation is stopped by the spirit, leaving residual sugar up to 17% alcohol. The French have been enjoying this liqueur as an apéritif and a digestive tonic for centuries.

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Maison de Lamartine

Maison de Lamartine has been named in honor of the famous 19th century poet, diplomat and historian, Alphonse de Lamartine. The Domaine was founded in 1928 by Claude-Henri Trénel who was joined by his son André. The estate is now run by Hervé de Boissieu who is assisted by Odile and Bruno Chambe, niece and nephew of André Trénel. The cassis (blackcurrant) fruit for the Crème de Cassis de Bourgogne liqueur come from Burgundy and are chosen with care to obtain the best result. They are made exclusively from regional fruits selected for their excellent flavor. The fruits are macerated in neutral alcohol for 1 to 6 months before straining, pressing and filtering. Then, sugar is added to produce a liqueur ready for bottling.

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Dr. André Parcé / Domaine du Mas Blanc

Situated at the foot of the Pyrenees Mountains near the Spanish border lies Banyuls. The terraced vineyards are baked by the summer sun and swept by the strong mistral and Tramontane winds off the Mediterranean Sea. The late Dr. André Parcé of Domaine du Mas Blanc was perhaps the region's most enthusiastic advocate. His family has been farming in the Languedoc-Roussillon since 1625. A research chemist by trade, Dr. Parcé was also mayor of Banyuls and the chancellor of l'Academie Internationale du Vin, in addition to running the family wine business. 70+ year old vines of Grenache make up a minimum of 75% of the intense Banyuls. Robert Parker has noted that "Dr. Parcé's Banyuls are the reference point for this micro-appellation" and praised Andre and son Jean-Michel as "among the most highly esteemed winemakers in all of France." After tasting these singular and intense wines one will forever think of Parcé as the benchmark for Banyuls.
